The Player

- Become a 'Borough Boy or Girl' by embodying at all times Penryn's core values of Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline, Sportsmanship, Loyalty and Friendship.
- Set a positive example for others, particularly other players and supporters through the culture and ethos of the Borough way.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural or social background or religion.
- Understand the Penryn RFC club policy of zero tolerance for swearing, inappropriate language or behaviour towards team mates, opposition players, match officials, coaching staff, parents or spectators.
- Understand the Penryn RFC club policy of zero tolerance for psychical violence, threats or intimidation towards team mates, opposition players, match officials, coaching staff, parents or spectators.
- Players are not allowed to smoke, consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Be aware of the RFU Child Protection Guidance and the Penryn Safeguarding policies and procedures and know where to seek help if needed.

- Give maximum effort and strive for the best possible performance during training or a game, even if the team is in a position where the desired result has already been achieved or not.

Your Opponents

- Treat opponents with due respect at all times, irrespective of the result of the game.
- Safeguard the physical fitness of opponents, avoid violence and rough play, and help injured opponents.

The Match Officials

- Accept the decision of the Match Official without protest.
- Avoid words or actions, which may mislead a Match Official.
- Show due respect at all times towards Match Officials.

The Team Officials

- Understand the coaching staff are qualified and competent as a laid out in the Penryn coach's development pathway.
- Understand coaches are working in line with the latest RFU and CRFU guidelines and best practice models.
- Abide by the instructions of your Coach and Team Officials, provided they do not contradict the spirit of this Code.
- Show due respect at all times towards opposition Team Officials.
- Show due respect to the interests of all supporters.

Breaches of the above code of conduct or any matters deemed of a serious nature will be referred to the Youth Section Disciplinary Committee.
